

Creating your own colour wheel using household objects.



Colour Mixing:

The 3 Primary Colours are Red, Blue and Yellow.

To make different shades of orange you mix Red and Yellow.

To make different shades of green you mix Yellow and Blue.

To make different shades of purple you mix Blue and Red.

Warm up- Using paints or colouring pencils experimenting mixing the primary colours to see what colours you can create!

Tip- If using colouring pencils start with the lighter colour. For example, if you are creating orange start with yellow then layer it with red to blend the colours easier.

Now for the fun part! Go on a hunt around your house and see how many different objects you can collect (make sure you ask your parent/career first) of the different colours in the colour wheel.

Take a picture of your colour wheel and send it to your teacher to look at. Be as creative as you like! The size of the wheel is up to you. If you are struggling to find objects in a certain you can always paint or colour in that section.

Challenge- How many different shades of each colour can you find for your colour wheel.
