




Year 1 Weeks 11-12

We aim for the children attending school to complete the following activities on each day. If you would like to follow the same timeline at home then you may or you can pick and choose activities you would like to complete. There is no expectation you complete all of the activities.

Week 11 Under the Sea	Writing	Reading	Topic or craft	Maths
Monday 	Write a setting description for under the sea. Think about your 5 senses- What can you see? What can you hear? What can you feel? What can you taste? What can you smell? Tuesday 	Create a story map using under the sea as your setting and a sea animal as your main character. What happens to your main character? Is there a problem that needs solving? Are there any other characters? Do they stay under the sea?	Can you find a book that is related to the Under the Sea topic? Read or listen to it. Are there any words that you haven't heard before? Write them down and ask someone else if they know what they mean. Write down the meaning too.	Computing- Use painting software to mix colours. Could you create your own Under the Sea setting?	
Wednesday 	Write your Under the Sea story using your story map to help. Don't forget to use capital letters, full stops, phonics and conjunctions!	I spy... Write down all the rhymes you remember hearing and underline the rhyming words.</p> <p>Can you create your own rhyme on how to behave in school?</p>	<p>Can you make a colourful jellyfish? Write these in your exercise book along with some facts about the country. What is the weather like there? What do they like to eat there? Are there any famous landmarks to see?</p>

Read your diary entry to someone else, would they want to visit the place from your diary?</p>	<p>After your research on the first aeroplane yesterday, complete the reading comprehension sheet below. You can either complete it in your exercise book or on the sheet.</p>	<p>Science- Go for a walk. Can you identify the trees that you see? What are they called? Write a list in your exercise book. Are they deciduous or evergreen trees? Now, think about the types of trees you might find in hotter and colder countries. Can you name some? Why do these trees grow where they do? The Wright Brothers

Wilbur and Orville Wright were brothers. They grew up in the USA. They are known for inventing and testing the first aeroplane.

Their Childhood


Wilbur was born in 1867. Orville was born a few years later in 1871. The brothers loved to build things and think of new ideas. Their father gave them a toy helicopter. It flew with the help of rubber bands. This made them want to fly.

The brothers found out lots about how birds fly. This helped them to understand how to make wings for aeroplanes.

Their Flights

Orville made the first flight in an aeroplane. This was in North Carolina in December 1903. He flew 120 feet through the air. This is as long as four and a half buses. The flight only lasted for 12 seconds but the brothers did not give up. Wilbur tried to fly a new aircraft in November 1904. This time, the flight lasted for over five minutes.
