Literacy	<p>Compulsory: Complete each week of your weekly spelling homework and hand it in on time.</p> <p>This should be done on your homework book.</p> <p>Compulsory: Complete your reading and discussion of the book 5 times a week and record this in your reading diaries.</p>	<p>Choose a word of your choice (not too tricky) and write down as many words as you can think of that rhyme with it.</p> <p>Record in your homework book.</p>	<p>Write some sentences about you! You could start with: "I am..." "I have..." "I like..."</p> <p>Record in homework books.</p>	<p>Learn one of your favourite stories using actions to help you.</p> <p>You could present this to the class or film yourself at home.</p>	<p>Make a poster telling people why they should visit Reading. Where should they visit (Prospect Park, The Oracle, etc.)? You could include drawings or photos.</p> <p>Include places you really enjoy going.</p> <p>Record on paper so we can display!</p>
Maths	<p>Compulsory: Find a fun way to practise your number bonds to 10.</p> <p>Record these in your homework diaries.</p>	<p>Roll 2 dice and add together the numbers it rolls on. Play with an adult to see who gets the highest answers.</p> <p>Record your number sentences in your homework book.</p>	<p>Count how many hops on one leg, jumps and star jumps you can do in one minute. Ask an adult to time you.</p> <p>Record in homework books.</p>	<p>Look around your house or even your garden for things you could measure. Using a ruler measure the different objects you find. What is the longest object? What is the shortest?</p> <p>Record the object and its length in your homework books.</p>	<p>Using a variety of 2D shapes, make your own pizza. Label each shape you have used with its name and properties. Include what you have used the shape for on your pizza. Make sure you colour your pizza in!</p> <p>Record on to paper or use the computer.</p>
Science	<p>Make a list of things that give us light.</p> <p>Record in your homework books.</p>	<p>Choose one of the seasons and draw a picture of yourself in the clothes that you would wear. Label the clothes and why you have chosen them.</p> <p>Record onto paper.</p>	<p>Have a go at making shadow puppet shapes with your hands. You will need a dark room and a light source. What different shapes can you make? Can you make any animals? You could take pictures or make a list in your homework book of shapes you made.</p>	<p>Collect leaves from different trees. Can you find out what the tree is called? Stick the leaves onto some paper and label them with their name to build up your own leaf library.</p> <p>Record on paper.</p>	<p>Go on a bird watching walk. Make a record of what birds you see. When you get home, draw and label the birds. Can you find out some facts about the different birds you saw?</p> <p>Record on paper or in your homework book.</p>

It is expected that children will complete reading, spelling and maths tasks every term. We ask that children complete a minimum of 30 points of tasks over the two terms. (Spelling, reading and maths already makes up 15 of these points but they can do more if they want to)
