| Theme | Find 5 different mini beasts in your garden or in the park and take a photo of these. You could email your photos to your teacher. | Research 5 facts about the Great fire of London Record these in your homework diaries. | Draw and name 5 mini beasts. Record these in your homework diaries. | Keep a weather log for 2 weeks using the different weather symbols. If you want you could video yourself as a weather forecaster telling everyone what the weather is going to be like! Record this any way you would like. | Imagine you were living during the Great Fire of London. Write a diary entry about the night of the fire. What were you doing? Where were you? How did you wake up? How did you feel? Where did you go? Remember to use 'I' Record into your homework diaries or you could type it up on a computer. |
| Literacy | Compulsory: Complete each week of your weekly spelling homework and hand it in on time. This should be done on your homework book. Compulsory: Complete your reading and discussion of the book 5 times a week and record this in your reading diaries. | Memorise and perform a poem to the class. Can you include any actions? Remember to perform your poem with lots of expression! You could video yourself if you would rather! | Choose your favourite book and write a book review for a friend telling them why they should read this book. Record this on either paper, in your homework diaries or as a word document. | On the computer find a picture of a mini beast and describe it. Remember to include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Expanded noun phrases Verbs/Adverbs A range of openers A variety of conjunctions Exciting punctuation. This could be typed if you like. | Write a story about a minibeast. Think about where it lives, what it looks like, what happens to it in the story? Include some drawings to go with your story. Record on paper or in homework diaries. |
| Maths | Compulsory: Practise your 2, 5, 10,3 and 4 times tables. This can be done using TT rockstars/MyMaths or recorded in your own way Record this into homework books | Look around your home, can you find the following shapes?  List where you found them. (challenge - can you find any other 2D shapes?) Record on to paper or in your homework book | Make up 10 maths problems for a friend to solve. Using all 4 operations (+ - x ÷) Remember to use numbers that challenge you! Record these into your homework diary. | Go on a walk to your local park. Collect information on the different insects you see and present your findings using a bar graph. Record on paper or as a PowerPoint. | Design and create a snakes and ladders times tables game. Make it and bring it in for the children to play. |
| Science | Name 3 objects that are: - Living - Dead - Have never been alive Record this into your book | Go on a walk or look in your garden to find a microhabitat. What animals live in it? Record this into your book | Create a food chain for a jungle animal. Identify and name the different sources of food. Record this in your homework diaries. | Design a 'healthy food' plate. Thinking about what humans need to eat in order to remain healthy. Record onto paper | Design a healthy menu for a restaurant with at least 3 starters, mains and desserts. You must include adjectives to describe your food as well as pictures/drawings. This could be presented electronically or on paper. |

It is expected to complete reading, spelling and times tables tasks every term. It is expected for children to complete a minimum of 30 points of tasks over the two terms. (Spelling, reading and times tables already makes up 15 of these points but they can do more if they want to) Please make sure these homework tasks are completed to a high standard and children take their time when completing.
